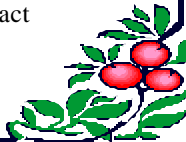
Hospitality Committee

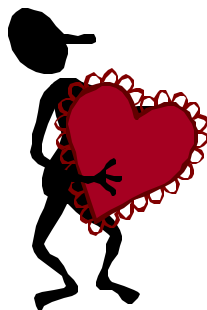

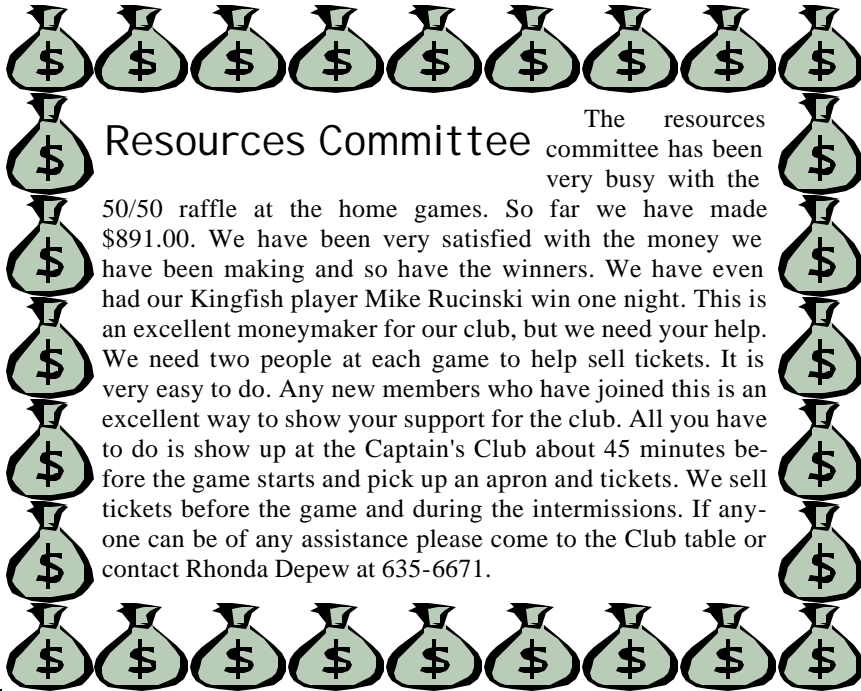
Newsletter Help Wanted

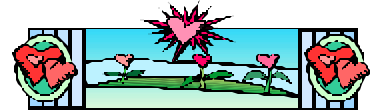


Resources Committee

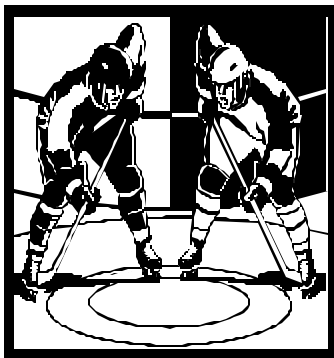
